This year we increased our STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Mathematics) focused activities to include special projects, group activities, hands on experiments and through interactive activities at the Eureka McConnell Science Museum!

And the reward for all this "hard work" and excellent attendance over the summer? A trip to Mimi's Ice Cream in Delta and our annual trip to Bananas in Grand Junction, of course! Finishing off another summer of laughter, recreation, friendship, and adventure (with a lot of learning along

the way)!

Our Youth Development Program addresses the deficiencies and challenges faced by the school age children of the Participants in our Transitional Housing Program. We offer a 4-5 day a week After School and Summer Program with goals to empower school-age children to reach their full potential by providing academic support, mentorship, and life skills development.

In 2023, we served a total of 65 school age children with 45 children attending our programs full time. Out of the 45, we saw each child advance on average 2 grade levels with school attendance rates improving by 89%. Each child in our program showed healing and growth with a reduction in trauma related issues, and in the development of their sense of belonging, identity, purpose and agency.
